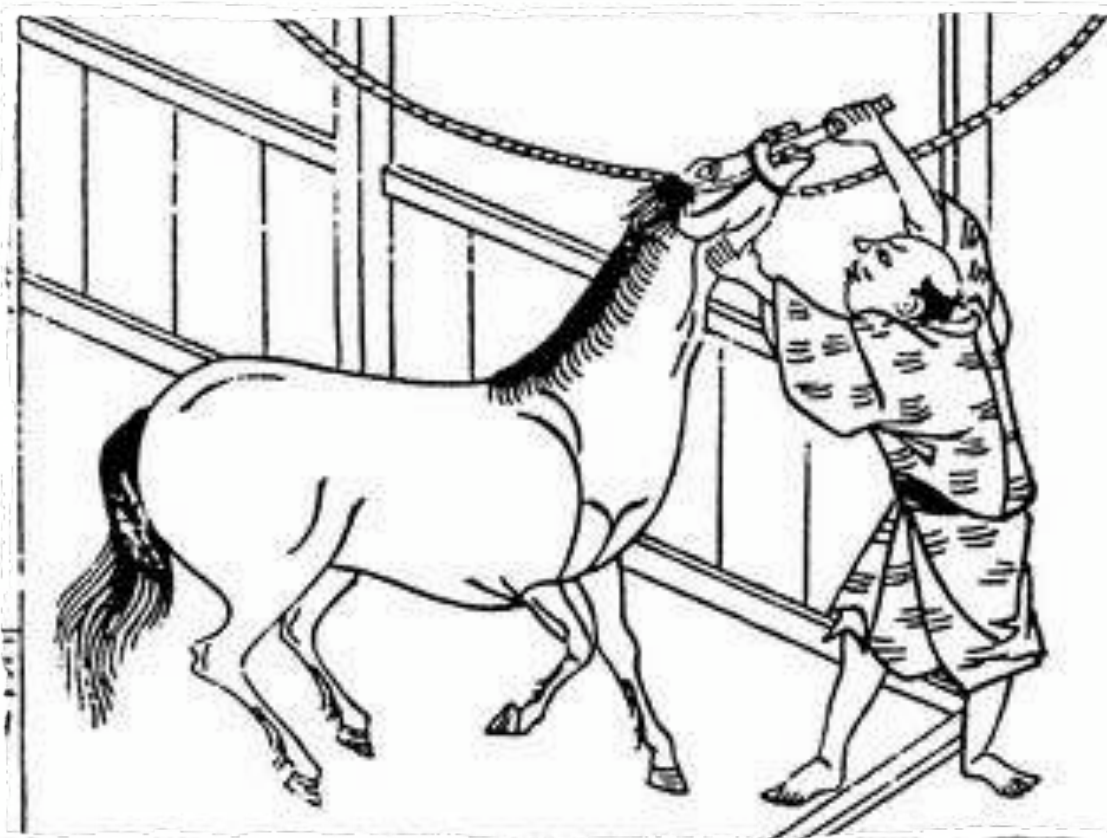

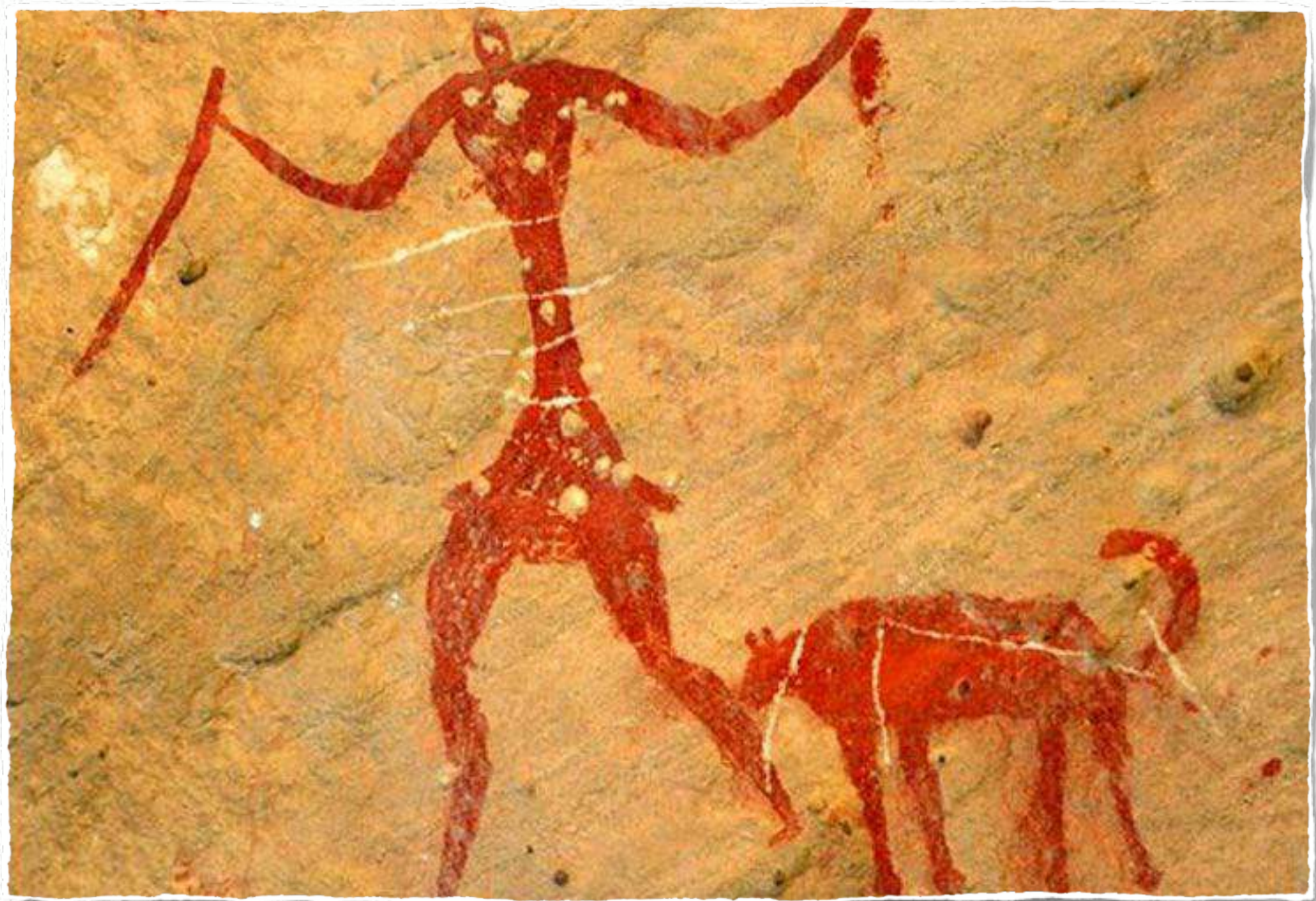

Herb Dosing For Pets

Cats

Tinctures: .1ml-.2ml

Powder: 1/8 tsp

Dogs

Tinctures: 5-20 drops

Powder: 1/8 - 1 tsp

2-3 Times Daily

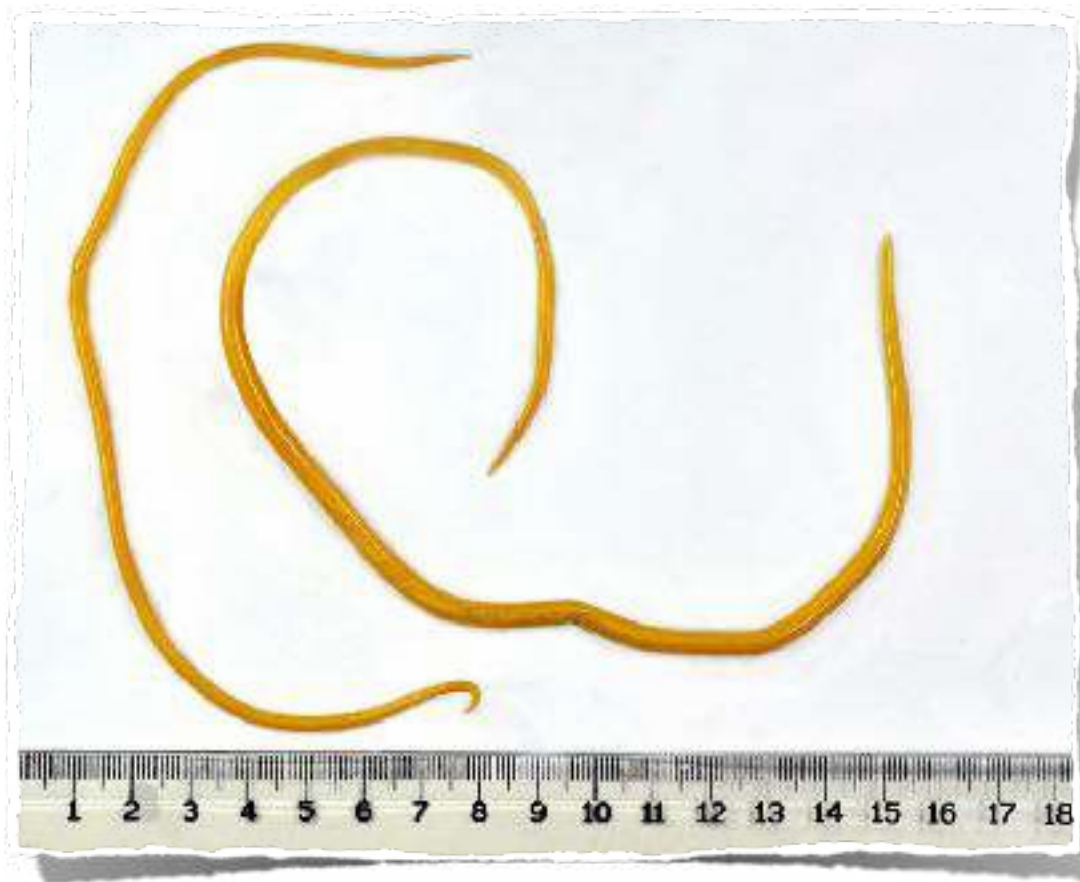

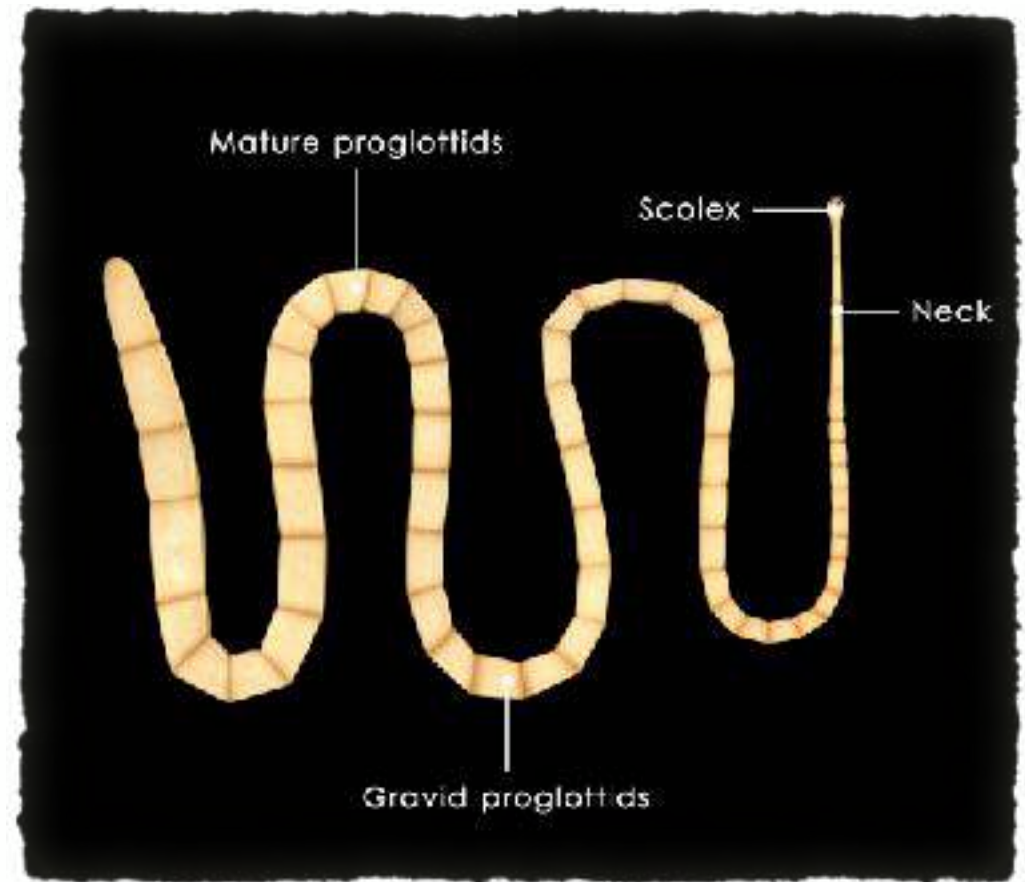
